General Information

First Day of Practice: All rowers--Monday, March 15, 2010

Last Day of Practice: Tuesday, May 25, 2010

(Teams going to USRowing Youth Nationals, if any, will practice through June 13.)

Practice dates and times: Monday-Friday, 3:30 - 6:00pm and Saturday mornings (times to be announced) Please note: novice crews will have practice on only some Saturdays

Location: Wayland Town Beach (<http://wwcrew.org/about/boathouse>)

The roster will be distributed for the purposes of carpooling with other teammates. A parent-organized bus to practice from Weston High School has been available in previous seasons; information will be emailed at a later date.

NOTE: PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF RESIDENTS NEAR THE LAKE BY DRIVING SLOWLY IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD AND BEING VERY OBSERVANT OF PEDESTRIANS, CHILDREN, PETS, ETC.

Cancellation of practice: We practice in all weather except active lightning storms or other extreme conditions. Because our weather changes rapidly, rowers should assume practice will be held regardless of the weather, and dress appropriately, unless they are told by a member of the coaching staff that practice has been cancelled.

WWCrew Participation Fee: The WWCrew fee is \$855 (\$765 Participation Fee, \$50 Equipment Maintenance Fee, and \$40 Town Beach Usage Fee which goes to the Wayland Park and Rec. Dept.). Our fees cover only our operating costs, which consist primarily of coaches' salaries, but also include gas for coaches' launches, regatta fees, and local travel expenses. We offer a \$50.00 sibling discount off the participation fee for the second child in the program. Refunds will be given within the first two weeks due to injury or membership limits.

Scholarships: It is the policy of Wayland-Weston Crew not to exclude anyone due to financial reasons. We recognize that crew is an expensive sport, and in keeping with our mission, we wish to provide the opportunity to participate to all who are interested. Full or partial scholarships are available.

Please contact the WWCrew Athletic Director (Barbara Sheffels, 508.358.5461, or barbsheffels@comcast.net) for confidential, partial or full fee waivers. We do not ask you for personal financial information. Please do consider the following: Other sports at Wayland High School require a \$225 activity fee. Also, we must pay the Town of Wayland \$40/rower regardless of the fees collected. Covering this amount of the fee, if possible, is very helpful to your child's team.

Parent Volunteers: We welcome your ideas and participation! Wayland-Weston Rowing Association is an all-volunteer organization, and we need your help to make this team a success. It only works because of what you do, from organizing fundraisers to ordering uniforms to chaperoning buses to running the food tent on race day, and on and on. There are so many different ways to help, and it is a fun way to meet other parents and learn more about your rower's new passion. Please fill out the parent volunteer form included in this packet.

Work Party Participation: The success of your team depends on more than just showing up to practice. The maintenance and care of our equipment, our boathouse, and our home course are essential. Therefore, each team member is expected to dedicate a minimum of five hours of participation per season to these activities.

Communication: We use email extensively for communication. Email addresses are to be used only for crew-related information. Hotmail users (and possibly others) need to turn off junk mail detection for messages sent to wwcrew_parents@wwcrew.org and wwcrew_students@wwcrew.org (click here for email addresses <http://wwcrew.org/about/organization>)

Registration Limits: Team size is limited by our equipment and coaching resources, safety considerations, and our state and town permits. To the extent possible, Wayland-Weston Crew will not cut rowers from our program. However, if enrollment exceeds resources, the first two weeks of practice in each season will serve as a try-out period. Any participant who is unable to continue in the program due to these restrictions after the try-out period will be refunded. Evaluation criteria include, among other things, a positive attitude, full participation in workouts, ability to run two miles, and the ability to pick up the fundamentals of the rowing stroke.

April Vacation Practices: In keeping with the varsity sport requirements of both Wayland and Weston High Schools, Varsity AND Novice rowers are expected to attend practices during April vacation. This week is an important time for training. The first weekend, juniors are allowed to miss practice in order to visit colleges but are required to be back at practice on Tuesday afternoon. Any regattas scheduled for this first weekend are OPTIONAL. Attendance Tuesday through Saturday may affect placement in boats.

Wayland-Weston Code of Conduct

The cornerstone of this code of conduct is **RESPECT**. Athletes are expected to treat the coaches, volunteers, administrators, parents, and each other with respect. The same respect is afforded to the athletes by the coaching staff and Board of Directors of WWCrew.

Participation in rowing is both a privilege and a responsibility. Athletes earn recognition for their achievements as representatives of their school, the team, and their community. When athletes accept this privilege, he or she must live up to the high standards of our code of conduct.

As a prerequisite for participation in the Wayland-Weston Crew program, participants and parents are expected to sign this statement that commits the participant and parent(s) to follow the established training rules and abide by the WWCrew Code of Conduct.

Team Rules and Regulations:

1. A participant shall always be respectful toward another rower, coach, volunteer, board member or any other person. Participants will not harass, ridicule, or humiliate any other individual. Prohibited actions include verbal or nonverbal disrespect, psychological, or physical abuse. In addition, participants must:
 - a. Treat officials, coaches, opponents, teammates, and volunteers with respect.
 - b. Control their emotions at all times and never argue with officials or volunteers.
 - c. Represent the club with dignity and good sportsmanship at all regattas and regatta trips.
 - d. Refrain from using obscene language and gestures.
 - e. Follow the coach's instructions both on and off the water at all times.
2. Rowing equipment is very expensive and must be handled with care. Unnecessary talking and horseplay is not permitted when handling equipment. All athletes must participate in routine maintenance and storage of equipment. Report problems to the coaching staff immediately.
3. Participants shall arrive at practice, meetings, and regattas at the properly scheduled time. Participants are expected to attend practices daily and on Saturday based on each season's schedule of practices. Both effort and performance are important aspects of attendance and are expected by the coaching staff, as well as your fellow teammates.
4. April vacation practices for both the varsity and novice teams are crucial to Spring success. Missing these practices may affect boat placement. Unexcused absences are unacceptable. Excused absences must be minimized.
5. Pre-season practices for the Fall season are also crucial to the team's success. Practice for the Varsity squads will begin prior to the start of school in the Fall Season.
6. Participants are expected to show initiative and dedication to self-improvement and training when not on the water or in between seasons.
7. All participants are required to show respect for the neighborhoods and community property surrounding Lake Cochituate. There is absolutely no littering, loitering or trespassing on private property. Athletes shall participate in regular cleanup of the beach property, beach house, and the parking lot.

Wayland-Weston Code of Conduct (Cont.d.)

Substance Abuse Policy:

The use and/or possession of alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco products or any controlled substance is strictly prohibited during the entire school year, at all crew events and any related function or activity, regardless of where such function or activity is held.

Our substance abuse policy is aligned with the policies of Wayland and Weston High Schools, the full texts of which are available on each school's website. As varsity athletes at both high schools, Wayland-Weston Crew athletes are required to comply with the schools' substance abuse policies, and are subject to the disciplinary measures outlined in those policies.

Procedures:

Wayland-Weston Crew participants are required to display good citizenship and sportsmanship in connection with their participation on the team. Coaches have the authority to suspend a rower temporarily for failure to comply with rules and regulations, for displaying poor sportsmanship, or when the participant's safety or safety of others requires such actions.

Disciplinary action for a violation of the Code of Conduct will be commensurate with the nature and extent of the violation, and may include direction to stop the offensive behavior, temporary suspension, or removal from the team for a season or permanently. Consent of the Board of Directors is required prior to removal of a participant from the team.

If a rower has violated any provision of this code of conduct, the following procedure will be implemented:

1. The coach will immediately address the concerns with the participant, as well as document the infraction. This action by the coach constitutes the first warning. Any infraction of the substance abuse policy will also result in immediate contact with the participant's parent/guardian.
2. The program director/head coach and the Director of Coaching shall be notified of the infraction. If a further violation is committed, a parent will be contacted. The participant will be asked to take three days off from practice, and talk with the coach prior to returning to the team. This constitutes the second warning.
3. After a third violation of the Code of Conduct, the participant will be asked to leave the team for the season.
4. Depending on the severity or repetition of the violation, this issue may be further discussed with the Board of Directors, and the athlete may be removed from the team for the season or permanently.
5. A participant subject to disciplinary action may request a meeting with his/her parent(s)/guardians(s), the coach, the Director of Coaching, and representative(s) of the Board of Directors to discuss the action.

Commitment Statement:

We, the undersigned, acknowledge receiving and reading this Code of Conduct. We understand and agree to abide by these rules of conduct. We further acknowledge that failure to return this document signed by both the participant and his or her parent or guardian renders the student rower ineligible to be a member of Wayland-Weston Crew.

Release of Liability



IN CONSIDERATION of being given the opportunity to participate in any USRowing activity, including scheduled, supervised club activities, and registered regattas, during the policy term 12/31/09 – 12/31/10, I, for myself, my personal representatives, assigns, heirs, and next of kin.

1. I ACKNOWLEDGE, agree and represent that I understand the nature of Rowing Activities, both on water and land based, and that I am qualified, in good health, and in proper physical condition to participate in such Activity.

2. I FULLY UNDERSTAND that: (a.) ROWING ACTIVITIES INVOLVE RISKS AND DANGERS of serious bodily injury, including permanent disability, paralysis and death ("Risks"); (b.) these Risks and dangers may be caused by my own actions, or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the Activity, the condition in which the Activity takes place, or the negligence of the Release named below; (c.) there may be other risks and social and economic losses either not known to me or not readily foreseeable at this time; and I FULLY ACCEPT AND ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS AND ALL RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOSSES, COSTS, AND DAMAGES I incur as a result of my participation in the Activity.

3. I AGREE AND WARRANT that I will examine and inspect each Activity in which I take part as a member of USRowing and that, if I observe any condition which I consider to be unacceptably hazardous or dangerous, I will notify the proper authority in charge of the Activity and will refuse to take part in the Activity until the condition has been corrected to my satisfaction.

4. I HEREBY RELEASE, discharge, and covenant not to sue USRowing, the Club, the Regatta, their administrators, directors, agents, officers, volunteers and employees, other participating regatta organizers, any sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises, on which the Activity takes place, (each considered one of the Releasees herein) from all liability, claims, demands, losses or damages on my account caused or alleged to be caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the Release or otherwise, including negligent rescue operations; and I further agree that if, despite this release and waiver of liability, assumption of risk, and indemnity agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf, makes a claim against any of the Releasees, I WILL INDEMNIFY, SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS each of the Releasees from any litigation expenses, attorney fees, loss, liability, damage, or cost which any may incur as a result of such claim, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

and furthermore I/We authorize any school teacher, administrator, and/or employee or official of the Town of Weston and/or Weston School Committee to authorize any medical treatment for said minor which may become necessary during the course of such participation, and do hereby RELEASE, acquit, discharge and covenant to indemnify and hold harmless the Weston School Committee, the individual members thereof, the Town of Weston, a municipal corporation of the State of Massachusetts, and their successors, departments, officers, employees, servants, and agents (the "Releasees"), of and from any and all actions, causes of action, claims, demands, suits or liability, damages, costs, loss of services, expenses, attorneys' fees, and compensation ("claims"), which I/we may now or hereinafter have as the parent(s) or guardian(s) of said minor, and also all claims which said minor now has or hereafter may acquire, either before or after he/she reaches his/her majority against the Releasees, on account, of or in any way arising out of, directly or indirectly, said minor's participation in the aforementioned activities, including without limitation any and all known and unknown personal injuries, medical treatment, or property damage arising out of said participation, but excluding all claims against the Releasees based on gross negligence, or reckless or intentional conduct of the Releasees.
